

# Third Sunday of Easter Sunday, April 14, 2024: 8:30 am & 11:00 am Lord of Life Lutheran Church, Bismarck, ND Pastors John Streccius and Beth Walch

Our Purpose Statement: "Love All, Serve All, Welcome All as Christ."

The gospel for the third Sunday of Easter is always one in which the risen Christ shares food with the disciples, meals that are the Easter template for the meal we share each Sunday. In today's gospel, Jesus both shares the disciples' food and shows them the meaning of his suffering, death, and resurrection through the scriptures, the two main elements of our Sunday worship.

#### First Reading: 1 John 3:1-7

<sup>1</sup>See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. <sup>2</sup>Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. <sup>3</sup>And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure. <sup>4</sup>Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. <sup>5</sup>You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. <sup>6</sup>No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him. <sup>7</sup>Little children, let no one deceive you. Everyone who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.

**Second Reading: Jonah 2:1-10** 

¹Then Jonah prayed to the LORD his God from the belly of the fish, ²saying, 'I called to the LORD out of my distress, and he answered me; out of the belly of Sheol I cried, and you heard my voice. ³You cast me into the deep, into the heart of the seas, and the flood surrounded me; all your waves and your billows passed over me. ⁴Then I said, "I am driven away from your sight; how shall I look again upon your holy temple?" ⁵The waters closed in over me; the deep surrounded me; weeds were wrapped around my head <sup>6</sup>at the roots of the mountains. I went down to the land whose bars closed upon me for ever; yet you brought up my life from the Pit, O LORD my God. <sup>7</sup>As my life was ebbing away, I remembered the LORD; and my prayer came to you, into your holy temple. <sup>8</sup>Those who worship vain idols forsake their true loyalty. <sup>9</sup>But I with the voice of thanksgiving will sacrifice to you; what I have vowed I will pay. Deliverance belongs to the LORD! <sup>10</sup>Then the LORD spoke to the fish, and it spewed Jonah out upon the dry land.
